

As a feature of the 2018 National Western Spring Meet (April 19-21), the Tucson Region is offering a private tour of the Tucson Auto Museum, also known as "Wayne's Toys," after its owner, Wayne Gould. Wayne has collected a variety of impeccably restored vehicles and automobilia from around the country and has recently opened his facility to the public. There are between 50-60 vehicles on display. Those who register to attend the tour of the museum receive admission and transportation from the headquarters hotel and back for a charge of \$15 per person. There will be a cash bar and

light snacks available at the museum.

Although the museum tour is the only scheduled event during the meet, Tucson has many nearby attractions that will make arriving early or staying over an enticing option. Among them are the historic San Xavier del Bac Spanish mission and the world-renowned Pima Air Museum, as well as Saguaro National Park and the Franklin Museum - all within a short drive from the headquarters hotel. Plan to spend an extra day or two in Tucson to enjoy some of the local sights.

I purchased the Studebaker from a wonderful family in Wilmer.



Bringing a 1948 Offenhauser Engine to Life

Even though it's cold outside, the old Machine shop keeps running. I thought I would share a little about one job we are doing that has elicited a lot of interest. We have a 1948 Offenhauser engine we are attempting to bring back to life. It has not been an easy chore since parts for these engines are so rare to get. These engines were used in Marine applications then made their way into Race cars, Indy, sprints etc. We are making some head-way on it. Freddie and myself have researched, what few books we can find for information on this engine with the help of the owner. Oh and by the way the owner is a AACA member in Panama City, Fl. The one we have is a four cylinder with DOHC (Dual Overhead Camshaft) 16 Valve naturally aspirated (2) Carburetors). It will be installed in a 1948 Indy race car. We are having a set of forged pistons made by Diamond Piston Co. We are also making a set of Intake and Exhaust Valves. These pictures show where we have mocked the engine up checking clearances for the timing components. I'm thinking about doing a little update periodically as we make head-way on the engine. A New Project Comes Online



While the DeSoto has been hibernating, we have been looking for a new project. Having done a full restoration with the convertible, I decided to change it up and do a restomod. After looking around I decided I wanted one of the first true muscle cars, a GTO.

GTOs are getting very pricey with a minimum asking price for driver being around \$30,000. As we are planning a total re-do with upgraded chassis, drivetrain, etc., it would be ridiculous to get a perfectly fine car and destroy it.

It took about 4 months to find one that met our

requirements – it had to be an automatic (as the consoles are different from manual shifts) and it had to have had factory A/C so the firewall would be set up. I found a 1966 GTO on one of the websites that was located in North Carolina. I sent off contact information and nothing happened. About a month after initialling trying to contact the seller, I got a call that the car was still available. Someone had approached the seller before me but upon seeing the car, decided not to buy. He wanted the seller to drop the price.


My buddy Tommy and I made a mad dash in October to North Carolina, up on Saturday and back on Sunday. Tommy has a Silverado 2500 and we were lucky to get a relatively new UHaul trailer in Charlotte. This car would normally be called a barn-find, but in this case, it was a "beside the barn, under a tarp" find. Tires were flat, the back window was plexiglass and there was no driveshaft. The interior is relatively complete, although we suspected it had been a home for rodents at one time. The father of the man who was selling the car had collected Impalas starting from 1958. Most were in fair shape. The GTO was an odd ball that had been rescued from a crusher then basically ignored. The owner thought it was last driven by a high school student in the mid-80's.

Fortunately, it was a gorgeous day in the mountains and loading the car was relatively easy. As we were leaving, the temperature dropped and a northwest wind picked up. If it wasn't for Goggle Maps, we'd probably still be roaming around NC trying to find I-20. Despite the wind bucking the car, it rode like a champ on the trailer. For once we made it back to Mobile without incident.

The first thing we did was put cheap (well, kind of cheap)







tires on the car to get it to roll. Then we started to strip it down. We are a bit brighter than when we stripped the DeSoto. We've labelled everything, despite how rusted and/or mangled it is. We found the car had been hit both in the front and the rear at one time. As we disassembled, it became apparent that we would need new floors in the passenger area and trunk. Also, we realized we need to replace the rear light panel, front grill panel and the lower rear quarters. Further decisions will have to wait until we have it sand blasted.

The one thing that will make this restoration easier is: Everything is available on the web. There are many shops dedicated only to GTOs (ok, Goats, although I hate the nickname) or to A-Body GMs (e.g., Chevelles). So far, we have been stockpiling floors, fender panels and, of course, the first purchase was all the emblems! It will be quite a while before we can use them, but they are there to fondle if wanted/needed.

Our first tasks has been to get the car ready for blasting. The roof was in terrible condition with rust holes and lots





of fiberglass. We were afraid the body would get twisted when it comes off the chassis because there was not roof strength. So, we replaced it. It required a lot of delicate metal shrinking around the sail pillar, but its mostly done at this point.

I am wondering how much of the original car will be left when we are done.

See ya, '17! A quick look back at some of the biggest old-car stories of the last year

Every day of the year we're pounding the pavement to dig up the most informative, newsworthy, and entertaining stories from the collector-car scene, so after a year, it all becomes a little bit of a blur. Still, as we take a moment to review headlines from the year that was, several stood out for one reason or another, so let's take some time to revisit them before we jump right on in to 2018.

- 1. Route 66 resuscitation in the works. The movement to preserve Route 66 in some way or another ramped up this year, prompted in part by its placement on endangered lists and in part by the pending conclusion of a funding program. To address the latter, we've seen a number of proposed solutions, including the Route 66 Centennial Commission Act, a proposal to recommission Route 66, and legislation aimed at making Route 66 the next National Historic Trail. Expect to see more action on the National Historic Trail designation next year.
- 2. Significant cars see the sun again. While this list doesn't necessarily rank our most-read stories from the year, it does keep them in consideration, and two of our most-read stories concern long-thought-lost significant—or potentially significant—vehicles that automotive sleuths turned up. One, a 1951 VW Microbus Deluxe, sat in a German field for 50 years before a German collector determined it was the second-built Samba; it's now under restoration. The other, a 1968 Ford Mustang, appeared in Mexico with enough clues to reportedly identify it as a car used in the filming of Steve McQueen's Bullitt; it too is now under restoration.







- 3. Dune-buggy owners take on Texas ban. The roots of this story date back to 2013, but dune-buggy enthusiasts in Texas began sounding the alarm about the state's DMV revoking titles for their dune buggies, sand rails, and kit cars earlier this year. The Texas DMV subsequently scheduled a briefing on the issue and discovered that it's a thorny, complicated issue, one that may have national implications. A working group is expected to hammer out some solutions early next year.
- 4. Auto racing in Europe faces big challenges. Another story that's been brewing for a few years concerns the EU Motor Insurance Directive and a 2014 court ruling that may cause EU residents—including those in the UK, for now—to get insurance for any motor vehicle, regardless of whether it operates on public roads. The British tabloids reliably freaked out about nan's mobility scooter requiring insurance, but motorsports organizations also saw an existential threat in the court ruling's implications. Both the EU and the UK concluded consultations on the issue this year, but a recent UK court ruling seems to indicate that things are as dire as European motorsports enthusiasts have warned.
- 5. U.K. gives classic cars an official cutoff age. Also across the Atlantic, the EU, and the UK have been figuring out exactly how to define historic cars, which is not as trivial an issue as it first sounds. A vehicle's historic status may, for example, exempt it from city-wide old car bans, or exempt it from roadworthiness testing. And those definitions aren't just based on a vehicle's age, as we saw with the release of the Charter of Turin Handbook.
 - 6. The coming of the electric collector car. Perhaps our

April 1 story was more predictive than preposterous? With plenty of governments across the world setting sunset dates for the internal combustion engine and with electric vehicles capturing headlines left and right, perhaps we should expect more EV conversions of classic cars or more manufacturers to launch electric-powered replica/continuation/homage vehicles as Jaguar did this year with the E-Type Zero?

- 7. We go deep on ethanol, the Darien Gap, and more. One addition we made to the Hemmings Daily this year was the Sunday Hemmings In-Depth series, in which both Hemmings editors and contributors spend a little more time than normal exploring an issue. Matteo Giacon has made good use of the series to enlighten us about Italian cars while Jim Van Orden has used it to tell some tales from his youth that many can identify with. We've also used the series to do some mythbusting specifically of John D. Rockefeller's relationship with ethanol and whether Henry Ford designed the Model T as a multi-fuel car—to tally up all the various adventurers who have crossed the uncrossable Darien Gap on both two-wheels and four, and to list all the vehicles definitively lost to history.
- 8. Explosions of feedback. It probably shouldn't be a surprise at all that the two Hemmings Daily articles that garnered the most comments in 2017 were Open Diff pieces—designed specifically to start conversations and get reader opinions. It's also unsurprising, knowing our readership, that Kurt's question about what modern carmakers just don't understand and Joe Essid's question about the most archetypal car song would generate the most discussion.
