About the Concours d'Elegance

Last week I received an email from my friend Larry Zappone. Larry lives in the Seattle area. He

sent me some photos from the 2014 Pacific Northwest Concours d'Elegance. He was invited to participate in the "American Tail Fins" class. He didn't win anything ("What could possibly be more *elegant* than a 1956 DeSoto Pace Car?" he asked). Here are a couple of shots he sent. Larry also has a hard top Adventurer in the same color scheme that he got in the 1960's. His wife referred to it as "Old Thunder". Larry previously was Concours winner, he says he was the only entrant in his class. Anyway,



as I know little about the Concours events I did a little research. The following was snagged, bagged and edited from various websites.



The Concours d'Elegance has its roots in 17th century France, when the aristocracy would parade their horse-drawn carriages through the parks of Paris. With the advent of the automobile, Concours d'Elegance events evolved into competitions between automobile manufacturers, custom coachbuilders, and owners, whose vehicles were judged on the beauty of their design.

Notable American Concours d'Elegances include Pebble Beach Concours d'Elegance, Meadow Brook Concours d'Elegance (Michigan), Amelia Island Concours d'Elegance, Hilton Head Island Motoring Festival & Concours d'Elegance, Ault Park Concours d'Elegance (Cincinnati), Keeneland Concours d'Elegance (Kentucky), and Louis Vuitton Classic in midtown Manhattan.

Judging at a Concours d'Elegance

Prospective entrants must submit an application for each car, and the Concours field is selected from each year's pool of applicants. Many collectors spend years and hundreds of thousands of dollars purchasing and restoring a car in hopes of being chosen. Once a car is accepted to the Concours, it cannot again be entered in the event for ten years, with three exceptions; the ownership of the car has changed, the car has been restored, or if the featured marque is obscure, the Concours car selection committee can reach out to invite cars of varying restoration quality or cars that have previously been entered in the Concours - in order to provide a healthy representation of the marque for exhibition. 

hundreds of thousands of dollars, and more recently into the millions of dollars. For this reason, Continued along with its remarkable setting and amenities, the Pebble Beach Concours is considered the premier concours in the world

The Pebble Beach Concours Web site says that, "automobiles are judged for their historical accuracy, their technical merit and their style" There are two types of judges at each event. The first is the class judge. Each car starts out by being judged in their respective group by a class judge. The class judge is a recognized expert in the category and they are assigned to judge each car based on the originality and authenticity of the vehicle. These two traits are very important because a Concours d'Elegance focuses much of its attention on preserving automotive history. Each car must be correctly restored without blemishes, dents or marks on any part of the vehicle. Each vehicle is striving for a perfect score of 100, and whichever vehicle comes closest to that score in their class is awarded the First in Class honor.

Once a car wins the First in Class award, it's able to move on to the top round with the rest of the First in Class winners to compete for the Best of Show award. The Best of Show is

awarded by a second round of judges called honorary judges. Honorary judges take a more subjective approach to judging each car and focus their attention on the design, style and elegance of a particular vehicle. As each automobile drives along the First in Class ramp to receive its award, the honorary judges observe each vehicle. The cars are reviewed once again in the winners' circle and each honorary judge independently marks a ballot to indicate which car they believe should win the top honor. Once all the judges have voted, the best of show honor goes to the vehicle receiving the most votes.

But aside from the First in Class and Best in Show awards, there are several other Concours d' Elegance honors that contestants may be eligible to receive. A "barn find" preservationist class was added in 2001 and in 2009 a motorcycle class was added.

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






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
