The conversation with Tommy and Sheila Miller took place on the deck of their home overlooking a small lake. On the other side of the lake is a nine-hole golf course that Tommy and his son-in-law developed. Also on the other side is large building that holds many of their antique cars. The time was early evening and it was a phenomenally pleasant evening. I say this now because all of you will get the opportunity to experience this bit of heaven if you participate in the DSR rally this Sunday at 2:00 pm.

Tommy started by saying he was more interested in talking about their grandchildren than their cars. This couple is very family oriented. Sheila stated that they are both Mobile born and bred. They met in the 12th grade and were married two years later. They started their business in the backyard in 1977 and worked hard to make it grow. Along the way they had three children, two boys and a girl. Sheila stated that from their early ages, the children were informed that they were to remain in Mobile. Dating anyone who might at some time need to leave Mobile was discouraged. It appears that whatever the tactics, they got their wish. One son lives on Dauphin Island and the other in Theodore. Their daughter lives very close to them. Sheila pointed westward saying "she lives over there". They had had visits from all three within the last couple of days. You <u>must</u> have at least <u>two</u> people in your car, a driver and a navigator. We don't want the driver writing down answers !!!


Alternative?

WOMPIN' WAGON - C&E Gasser

Thirty five years after a piece of southern drag racing history was retired and put in storage, Peter W. Pearce brings the 'WOMPIN' WAGON back to life.



Peter, who was a life long friend of Danny Cummins, the driver of the '55 Nomad Gasser, is also the crew chief on the restored gasser. He spent countless hours bringing the Nomad back to life. The Wagon was honored on the cover of RPM magazine November 2011, a Top 10 pick at the prestigious Old Drag Races Reunion in Panama City, FL, and Best Restored Race Car. The car has also won many awards and trophies. Danny passed away in 2004 and now his brother Bubba drives the car at several drag strips.

The original Nomad was found in a junk yard ready to be crushed when a friend of Bubba Cummins told him about the find. In 1963 Bubba, Brother of Danny and Dickie Saunder started the build on the gasser. There were not many Nomad gassers, as these originally were about \$260 more than the Bel Air Convertible, somewhat of a luxury vehicle.

The wagon was built by Bubba, roll cage, interior, engine assembly, chassis and rear section. His friend J.C. Sizemore installed the straight axle. J.C. was a well known Southern legend and known all over the south with his famous 1955 Chevy "The Golden Rod".

The engine is a 1960 Chevy small block bored to 301 with Bow Tie Angle Plug iron heads J&E 12:1 pistons, Comp cam, Edelbrock Scorpion Aluminum Hi Rise manifold with Holley 780 cfm carburetor. Bubba still owns the original Hilborn Injection. The spark is from MSD 6AL, Hooker Special Wagon 3" headers, Aluminum valve covers with red detail, Moon tank and pressure pump, breathers and some nice detail pieces.



The engine is set back ten percent. The transmission is a Turbo 350 with an A-1 converter with 3500 stall hooked to a 1955 Chevy rear.

Front suspension is 1939 Ford spindles connected to a 1928 Ford Model A straight axle and springs. Front brakes are 1955 Chevy with 1970 Dodge rear brakes. The front wheels are early Kidney Beans and Steel in the rear with N&H slicks.

These Alabama boys did a great job. Body work by Jerold Nichlos, the '67 Marina Blue by DuPont was sprayed by Johnny McDonald of Classic Paint and Body. Other body modifications are a glass removable front end, '55 with Nomad trim pieces. A Nomad rear bumper is Pression Metal.

A T-Bird bucket seat with blue & white trim by Port City Trim Works and full Aluminum Interior. A 60's style Sun 8500 tachometer, Stewart Warner gauges, dash has original '55 trim, original style removable steering wheel, and car is lettered as it was in the sixties.



Peter who's nick name was "Sneaky Pete" has done a remarkable restoration for his friend "Dirty Dan" Side by Side and Hand in Hand, Always. Were these guys the original Alabama Gang?


from the deafening PA system.

He is the owner of a 1966 Corvette and told the group about a recent rally that was held in Georgia that he and his son participated in. He was most proud that he had no problems with the vehicle on the roundtrip there nor during the event.

VP Fuller offered figures for two quotes he had gotten on having a new roof installed. A motion to approved the March report was made by H. Thoms, seconded by B. Paquet and approved. T. Lawrence, Activities Coordinator reviewed one request for a display on April 15th in Axis, AL. There was no interest expressed. Also an invitation to participate in the Mobile Bay Bears baseball team's Saturday Night Auto Showcase was provided. Several questions about this were made. Tim will report back on those at the next meeting. He noted that one of the few people in Mobile with an antique auto, Tommy Britt, has had a mild stroke and is not able to handle the requests for weddings. If anyone is interested in doing this or knows someone who would be, there were asked to see Tim after the meeting adjourned. Walt Fuller, 2012 Mother's Day Car Show Chairman reviewed all of the jobs that need to be done for the show. He had several members who volunteered their time as well as helping the show be a success by sponsoring trophies. He will finalize any other openings before the April meeting. The VP, Secretary, Editor, Member-at-Large and Webmaster had no new business.

The 50/50 drawing was won by Betty Wilson prior to the 8:30 adjournment.


