An Interview with Zeno and Rheba Chaudron

Of course, everyone knows that Zeno Chaudron is our club President and that he and Rheba own a beautiful orange 1969 Camaro. They graciously agreed to this interview despite having been out at a family reunion for the day. Zeno said it was relatively small affair compared to a reunion of Rheba's family. She is one of 15 siblings and their reunions can exceed 150 people.

After roaming around their neighborhood in Tillman's Corner, Zeno flagged us down when we had stopped at this father's house because I recognized Zeno's truck. It turned that out Zeno's son Trey (also a DSR member) was visiting and had borrowed the truck. Zeno, Rheba and

Evelyn (Trey's wife) welcomed us into a minor mad house with children bouncing around. The children included Trey and Evelyn's two children. Zheba shoo'd them off so we could talk.

Rheba was born in Butler Alabama and came to Mobile to work at the Vanity Fair factory. She worked there for 21 years until they closed. After Vanity Fair closed, she went back to school and obtained a ophthalmology assistant degree. She's been working at Vision America for 14 years. Rheba



worked with Zeno's sister and mother at Vanity Fair. As a result of that friendship, she was maid of honor when Zeno's sister got married. While she had been aware of Zeno, she actually didn't meet him until the wedding. Rheba and Zeno were married in 1975 and Trey was born in 1977.

Zeno's father was in the Air Force and stationed in Limestone Maine when Zeno was born. The family moved to Mobile when Zeno was 17 months. Zeno got his first car, a 1969 Camaro Z28, when he was in the 11th grade at Theodore High School. When he graduated in 1972, he began working in automotive shops and started working in Woodrow Nolan's automotive machine shop in 1983. He bought the shop, Auto Fleet Parts & Machine, in 1990.

Zeno has always preferred drag racing. He said that while others, including Rheba, were headed to church on Sunday morning, he was headed out to the track. After Zeno and Rheba got married, Zeno sold his Camaro because he said getting a washer and dryer took priority over racing. He didn't start drag racing again until 1986. When he did, he raced his 1972 orange Nova


