An interview with Stacy and Tim Lawrence

Stacy said they WERE getting married. Tim said he wanted to get married right then. Stacy said yes and they were married at the court house later that day. This will explain the pink romper that Stacy is wearing in the photos as well as the exquisite brown plaid shirt Tim has on. is a charmed story. A customer of Tim's who knew they had been trying to have a baby and, failing that, adopt one, casually mentioned the possibility of a private adoption. Tim reports that, not thinking she was serious, forgot about the conversation and, of course, never told Stacy. A few months later, he got a call from the customer who said something like "well, the baby's ready, when are you coming to get it?" A rather stunned Tim raced from work, went to Stacy's school and begged the principal to speak to Stacy. Stacy came to the office and Tim immediately asked her if they wanted a baby and that she had to make a decision immediately. I gather it was Stacy's turn to be stunned, but a positive decision was made. Later that day they were in possession of Andrew and were totally clueless about what to do. They had nothing. When they arrived home, the house was full of friends, family and co-workers who had brought various items needed for a new born. Further, they had a neighbor who had a seven-month old, and she provided a lot of initial guidance.

Along with the good comes some bad. About 10 years ago, they were both diagnosed with cancer. Tim was first diagnosed with throat cancer, then Stacy with breast cancer. As Stacy was recovering, Tim was re-diagnosed. They account themselves extremely lucky as they now are survivors of notable standing.

Tim has always been a car buff. His first car was a 1960 Thunderbird. He bought and sold the same 1966 Chevelle three times. One of his favorites was a 1968 Oldsmobile 442 convertible. He sold that car to start his business. They've had many cars including MG's and Triumphs, a Saab Sonic, 1958 Volkswagon truck, an Austin Healey 3000 and a 1974 Triumph Stag convertible. Stacy said one of her favorites was a white Cadillac Sedan de Ville with its enormous red leather front seat.

The Lawrences have always pursued hobbies vigorously. They were into car racing, having a team that neared Nationwide status. They collected ceramic villages and electric trains. When Andrew asked to learn how to hunt, they jumped in. Thus, they acquired all the heads (and other stuff) in their house. They have hunted locally, but prefer to go on extended hunts for big game. For example, they have been to Alaska, British Columbia and northern Ontario, both hunting and fishing, with everything being processed and sent home. A favorite area is around Santa Fe. They both agree that it's the experience that's important, not what they bring home.

Deep South Region AACA General Membership Meeting Aug. 23, 2012

The meeting was called to order at 7:02 p.m. by President Z. Chaudron with 23 members, six of whom were officers. He asked member Buddy Givens to give the invocation in the absence of Kevin Crowell, Chaplain. The President then led the members in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Old Business: President Chaudron noted that examination of the clubhouse steps had been carried over from a previous meeting. He had checked them thoroughly and said they were in serious need of repair. A motion by B. Paquet that was seconded by T. Metclaf to replace the steps was made. The President stated that he had had a suggestion that when the repair was done, some type of "presentation platform" be built as well. A short discussion ensued. Member F. Bobo made a generous offer to repair the steps at no cost to the club. This received a well-deserved round of applause. The motion on the floor died for lack of vote. VP W. Pendergrass if he had been able to get a date for the club to display our cars at the Somerby Retirement Center. The answer was negative. T. Lawrence suggested we go ahead and approve the exhibit and when the date is determined, we can proceed. A motion to approve was made by B. Paquet, seconded by C. Lyles and approved. Also on the agenda was the October outing to the Bobo's riverhouse. The hosts will furnish the entrees' ('burgers & 'dogs) and asked members to bring accompanying side dishes. Further details will be discussed at the Sept. 27th meeting. A motion to accept the Bobo's hospitality was made by M Fuller, seconded by S. Lawrence, motion approved.

The 50/50 Pot drawing was won by R. Chaudron which was very unusual in that both Judy Bobo and Charlie Lyles were in attendance. A motion to adjourn came at 7:26 p.m. by B. Paquet, seconded by S. Lawrence and approved by members as they fled the meeting room for the kitchen where refreshments were waiting.


