

He recently moved his foreign car service garage from Washington Avenue to 2907 Old Shell Road. That's about a block east of Sage Ave. Pierre gave us a bit of interesting information about British cars and the reason you must use either Girling or Castrol GT vegetable based brake fluids. He said the British use natural rubber components and it is dissolved by petroleum base fluid which the U.S. uses with synthetic rubber components. So if you have a British built car, which includes MG, Jaguar, Sunbeam, Metropolitan, etc. remember this. To use U.S. type fluids will ruin any British built hydraulic system. 
