

Paul and Kathy Bowden have acquired a very fine 1967 red Oldsmobile 88


convertible with a white top. I've seen it and it is a beauty!

A GREAT RECIPE

We used to put a separate page in the newsletter for recipes and a lot of the ladies liked it, but we haven't been able to arrange that this year, so you will have to cut it out or copy this recipe. This is the very excellent cake that LaVerne made and brought to the July meeting in honor of Hop's birthday. It was so good many of the ladies requested the recipe and here it is:

BANANA-PINEAPPLE CAKE

3 cups flour (sifted)
1 tsp. soda
1 tsp. cinnamon
2 cups sugar
1 cups cooking oil
2 cup nuts (optional)
8 oz. crushed pineappl
(with juice)
1 tsp. vanilla
3 eggs
2 cups diced bananas

Sift dry ingredients together, adding sugar. Dice bananas, add to dry ingredients. Add oil, vanilla, eggs, and pineapple juice. Add nuts. Stir to blend, but do not beat. Bake 1 hour and 20 minutes at 350 degrees. Use bundt or tube pan, greased and floured Let cake cool 15 minutes before removing from the pan.
