

Let's talk about all of the above at the meeting Thursday night.


#### GROWDUS! MET GOES TO LUNCH



### Don't let fite claim your antique auto

One of the major causes for loss of antique cars is fire.

We must be very conscious of this fact and put more effort into preventing and dealing with fires.

Take the following precautions:

Disconnect the battery.

· • Check inside the vehicles for paper, rags, cans of chemicals, oil and other unnecessary items.

• Check the storage space where vehicles are kept for unnecessary paper, rags, cans of chemicals, etc.

• Keep combustible chemicals in

metal, not glass, containers.

Should a fire occur, call the fire department. Try to contain the fire until help arrives. Your first line of defense is a fire extinguisher. Know how to use it and be positive it is the correct type.

Fires are placed in four classes:

 Class A: Wood, cloth and paper fires. Water will bring them under control. Never use a Class A extinguisher on electrical, chemical or any other type fire.


\* Class B: Gasoline, oil, paint, grease and natural gas fires. Use foam, dry

chemicals or CO2 extinguishers.

 Class C: Electrical fires. Use dry chemicals or CO2 extinguishers.

 Class D: Ignitable metals. Use only a Class D extinguisher.




# Welcome
