

SICKNESS & ACCIDENTS OF MEMBERS:




Charlie's Life With Thunderbirds


I have been involved with Thunderbirds ever since you have known me, however you may not realize how long ago my association started. To begin with, the town of McClusky, North Dakota was founded in 1905 along a new railroad line into grain rich country. My grandfather and his brother started an auto repair shop in McClusky about 1918. In 1923 they became the local Ford dealer (the original Ford dealership was destroyed in a tornado). Later, grandfather bought out his brother's interest in the business and in 1928 he was able to build a new large brick dealership with a loan from a grain farmer. The first installment payed on the loan was a brand new four door Model A Sedan. The dealership was able to survive the Great Depression and later passed on to the hands of my father and his brother. My uncle still owns the dealership in the 1928 building.

In 1955 I was in high school and worked in the garage. The city of McClusky decided to hold a celebration to commemorate the 50th Anniversary of the city's founding. A big parade was one of the highlites planned for the celebration. My parents, along with others on the garage staff, worked long and hard to build a self propelled Anniversary Cake for the parade. A Model A chassis was shortened and a platform was built on the chassis. The cake rose skyward from the platform. The driver had very limited vision thru a thin slit in the bottom layer of the cake. The cake was one of the star attractions in the parade.

This finally brings me to another popular vehicle at the celebration; a Goldenrod Yellow 1955 Ford Thunderbird, driven behind the cake by your truly (wearing a black derby hat in the picture). The Thunderbird was a loaner from Ford Motor Co. and was available to dealers for special promotions. I was able to drive it several times and while I was greatly impressed there was no sense in dreaming. I knew there was no chance of having such a vehicle at that stage in life. In 1966 I did obtain my first Thunderbird, a 1956 which we still own. But that is another story.
