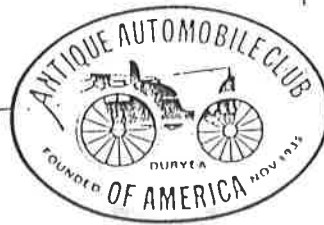

AUTO SHOW GETS 10-YEAR COMMITMENT

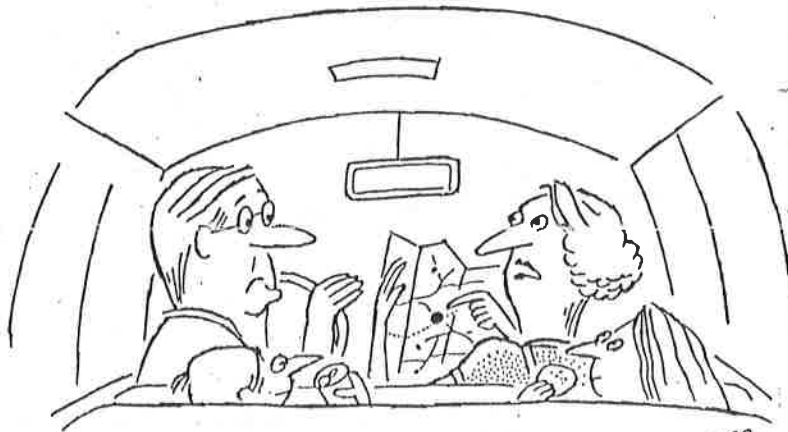

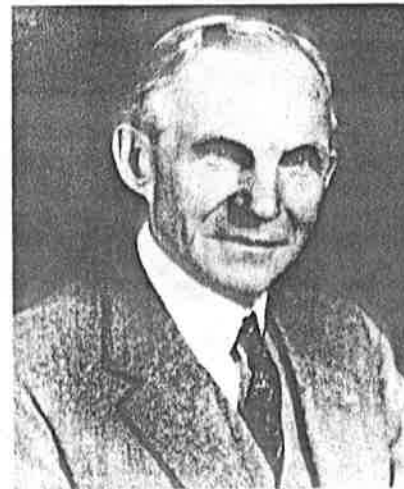

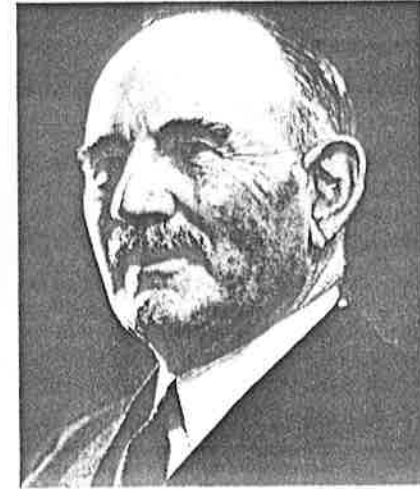
