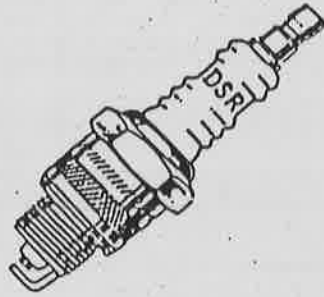

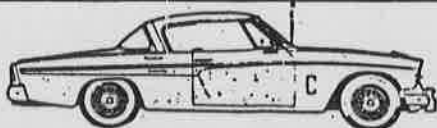

OUR LADY OF LOURDES SCHOOL

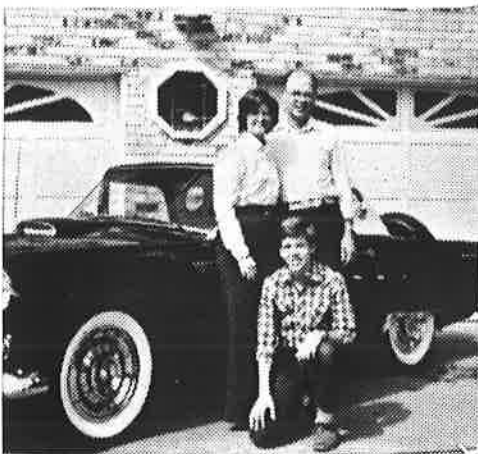

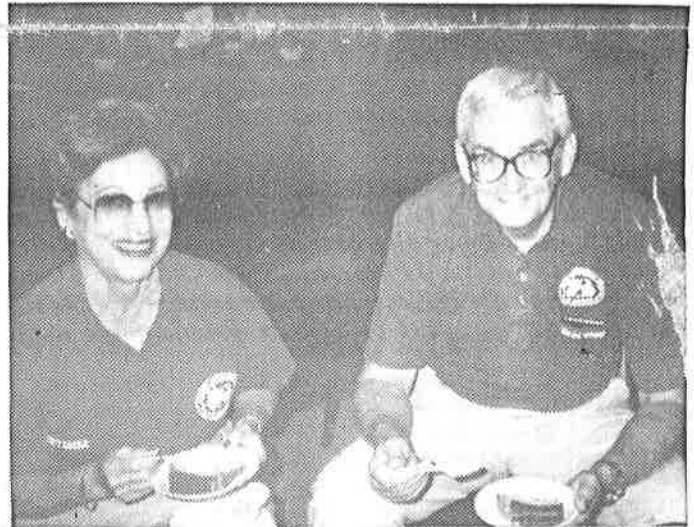

EDITORIAL

I started my editorial of June 1992 by writing — "Sorry, but your beloved Met must be destroyed." Actually, I wasn't that serious about it. I just wanted to get your attention. Today, that line is closer to the truth than it was then. Lawmakers and others, who have no interest in collector or historic vehicles, are trying to get rid of older cars that pollute the air. Many states have or are working on programs that pay a bounty of \$600 or more for each running and operable pre-1980 vehicle turned in.

I suppose you think that all the vehicles on your property are safe. Don't be so sure. Barbara Hillick, writing for the AMO newsletter, tells of a car collector in San Bernardino County, California. This collector had 120 Corvairs that were confiscated for a zoning violation. The zoning change was only three years old, but the cars had been there 10 years. The cars were neatly parked behind a 7 foot fence with a 24 hour watchman on duty. An anonymous caller complained about the cars, calling them a public nuisance. There was a hearing and the board decided the cars had to go. 100 of the 120 cars had been towed away at the time of the news article. Do you think that it couldn't happen to you? So did the Corvair collector.

There are bills in congress, and probably more on the way, that will have an effect on car collectors (you and me). Right now, Congress is trying to prohibit the manufacture of replacement parts for vehicles made before 1980.

What can we do? Write your senator or representative. Convince him or her that your car is not a polluter, and how little the car is used. Join or co-operate with organizations that are fighting for the right of car collectors, and please don't wait too long.

The World Organization of Automotive Hobbyists (WOAH) is an organization that stands up for all of us car collectors. I urge you to join it, if you are concerned about the government (including local) interfering with our hobby. The address is W.O.A.H., P.O. Box 1331, Palm Desert, CA 92261-1331. 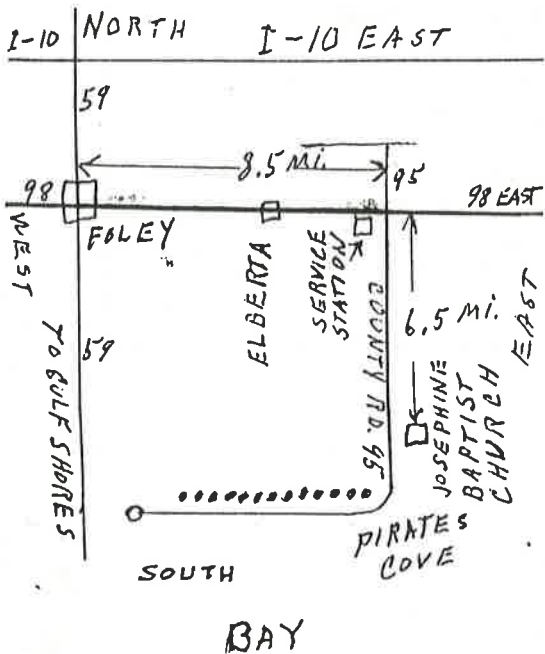
DSR FRIDAY NIGHT HOSPITALITY

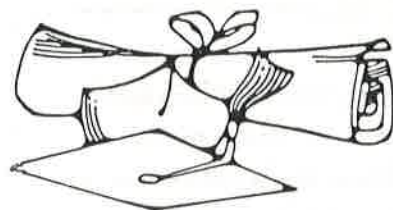
IMPORTANT NEWS!!
