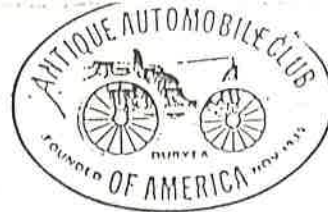
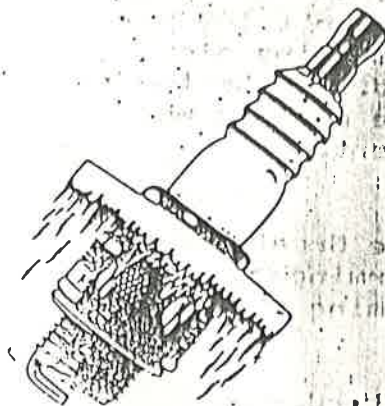

TOUR BANQUET

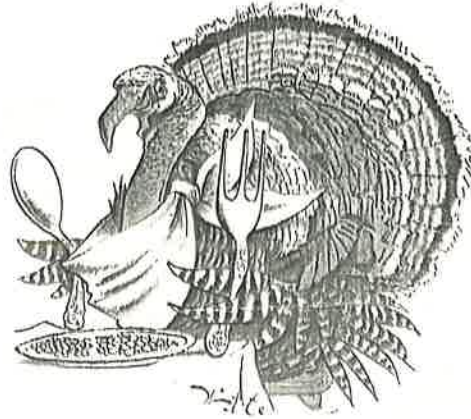
