

The DSR received a very nice card from Glenda Douglas, wife of Shannon, with the following message:







#### CUP CAKES or LAYER CAKE

2 cups sugar

cup shortening

4 eggs - (save whites for frosting)

2 teaspoons baking powder

2 cups flour

1 teaspoon vanilla

cup milk

Cream the sugar and shortening well. Add remaining ingredients. Mix well - pour into cake pans. ook until brown, about 20 minutes in 325 degree oven.

ICING

Beat egg whites real stiff. Pour enough water to dampen sugar. Cook until a small amount poured into a cup of cold water forms a hard ball - pour small amount of hot syrup into egg whites. Beat until stiff. Frost cake and put coconut on top and sides.

#### SEAFOOD GUMBO

2 quarts chicken broth

1 whole chicken

1 tablespoon gumbo file
1 cup chopped celery

cup chopped onions

2 cups bell pepper

Salt & pepper to taste

1 large can tomatoes

1 teaspoon hot red pepper (dried)


Brown & cup flour in bacon drippings. Add to chicken broth, which you will have after you boil chicken. Add large can tomatoes, salt and pepper.

2 cups okra - add this last. Cook 10 minutes - serve over rice.

You can add shrimp, crabs, or oysters to the pot. I put shrimp only - 2 or 3 pounds. Boil in one sack of shrimp boil.

You can easily double this


recipe if you need to.


This is the 1923 Model T touring the Bel Air Mall management will be giving away on the first week in October.
