Texas T Party 2023

This was John and I's first Texas tour and as it turned out, that was only one of several "firsts" for us. It was our first time to take a Model A (Woodreaux) to a Model T tour. Tallulah B, our 1927 touring just wasn't quite ready. This was our first time to visit the coastal town of Rockport, Texas, which is a beautiful area along Aransas Bay. Rockport very much reminded us of our own Gulf Shores back in the 60's and 70's.

Day one of the tour started with a parade through one of the local elementary schools on our way to Port Aransas. This run included a ferry ride which was a first time for us in an antique car. Another first was driving Woodreaux along the beach....certainly can't do that on Alabama beaches! Just after lunch we suddenly began blowing a huge cloud of white smoke out of the exhaust (a blown head gasket) and thus were the first to make use of the "Vulture Wagon". What a bummer!

The decision was then made to finish the tour in our modern vehicle. So, on day two we had the chance to visit the Fulton Mansion. From there we headed to the Aransas County Airport where the cars were lined up along the runway beside a Stearman Biplane. Tons of photos were taken as well as a video captured by a drone. These can be viewed on YouTube. Rides were also available in the biplane. Lunch was then served in one of the hangers. Back at the hotel the afternoon was dedicated to games and a Model T maintenance round table session.

Day four was the longest driving day of the tour and was 133 miles round trip. A coffee and donut stop was hosted in the small town of Refugio. Quite a welcome committee, including the mayor and chief of police. We then continued onto Goliad where the Presidio La Bahia is located. This fort was founded by the Spanish in 1749. Throughout it's history it changed hands several times including in 1836 when it was occupied by Texian forces. The entire force was massacred by Santa Anna and became a rallying cry in the fight for Texas independence. "Remember the Alamo and La Bahia" rang out frequently during the battles for independence from Mexico. Housed within the presidio was Our Lady of Loreto Chapel. The chapel remained intact and still serves the local community today. The fort was rebuilt around the chapel and is owned by the Catholic Diocese of Victoria. The cars were allowed to park within the walls and a great Tex-Mex lunch was provided.

Our final day took us to Goose Island to view a 1,000+ years old oak tree. From there a parade was held in the historic district of Rockport on our way to the old railroad depot for lunch. More photos and drone footage was taken to recreate a photo on display that was taken of the depot in the 1920's. Hurricane Harvey had almost destroyed the depot, but it was repaired and is now a wonderful museum.
